ABSTRACT

This document presents a typical example of how the extended abstract will look like and the instructions needed to prepare it to be included in the proceedings of the CWW2023. All abstracts should be written in English. In order to achieve graphical consistency, the extended abstract should be written using Microsoft Word. It should start with the paper's title, authors, authors' affiliation, address, and e-mail, followed by the Abstract's text and the keywords (up to six). Please, indicate the author making the presentation with an asterisk.

The abstract should be written in MS Word format in single-spaced in 12-point Times New Roman. Do not indent the text paragraphs. Please, briefly explain the aim and scope of your study, your materials and methods, and the main conclusions of the study. Max 2 figures/photographs can be placed in the abstract. Authors are requested to submit Abstracts (max 3 pages min 2 pages in length) in electronic form (MS Word) via email: technical_abstracts@cairowaterweek.eg, which is listed on the website of the conference. The incorrect formats may result in your abstract being returned to you by e-mail. The scientific committee will select the contributions for oral or poster presentations accordingly. Short abstracts less than two pages will be returned to authors.

A digital version of the CWW2023 Proceedings [1] will be published in the conference website. The committee will decide on contributions between an oral OR a poster presentation [2]. If the CWW2023 scientific committee accepts your extended abstract as an oral presentation, you will have the possibilities to submit a full paper for the special issue of CWW2023 with the Water Science Journal. The URL for the special issue will be announced with the extended abstracts acceptance.

The Extended abstract should ensure logical flow of information addressing the main problem of presentation, a clear methodology, and some tabulated information, when available. Two figures maximum are encouraged to give the committee the feel of the work presented and to share some results and outputs.


